Directorate General for Energy: Press trip on solar energy in Seville, Spain From Sunday 21 to Tuesday 23 April 2024

The EU is committed to becoming climate-neutral by mid-century. One of the central pillars for achieving this is to develop more renewable energy. This is not only good for reducing our emissions, but also important for reducing our dependence on fossil fuel energy imports (notably Russian gas) and for boosting growth and jobs in the wider economy. In the context of the EU's commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 55% by 2030 and the need to move away from Russian fossil fuels, the EU has recently adopted changes to the Renewable Energy Directive which include a binding target that at least 42.5% of EU energy (with an aspiration to reach 45%) should come from renewables by 2030.

Next to wind energy, the different solar technologies will make a key contribution to these targets. This press trip will focus on examples of solar energy projects close to Seville (Andalusia) - one of the regions where solar energy is most developed in Europe. The aim is to highlight different, innovative ways in which the region is exploiting its solar resources – and the benefits that this can offer.
